




getting ready for KINDERGARTEN

RUSD 4 Year-Old Kindergarten enrollment is now open for the 2017-18 school year!

4 year-old kindergarten is free for children who live within RUSD's boundaries. If your child will be 4 on or before September 1, 2017, he/she is eligible for 4K.

Enrollment is not complete until you provide the following documents, which you can bring to the Welcome Center (3109 Mt. Pleasant St.) or scan and email to enrollment.center@rusd.org:

- Your child's birth certificate or baptismal record
- Proof of address (utility bill, deed or lease)
- Your child's immunization records

Did you know? All children under the age of 5 who live in Racine County are eligible to participate in Imagination Library through United Way of Racine County. After registering, your first book, *The Little Engine That Could*, will take 90 days to arrive at your home. Your child will then receive one free age-appropriate book each month until they turn 5.
